The Grant County Quorum Court met on Monday, September 18, 2017 at the Grant County Courthouse at 7:00 p.m. with Judge Randy Pruitt presiding. Members answering roll call were Mark Allen, Danny Bone, Tyler Campbell, Tony Carter, Laith Adams, Mike Nevens, Pat O'Bryan, Jason Roshto, and Grant Westmoreland.

Judge Randy Pruitt called the meeting to order.

The minutes from the Quorum Court meeting held, August 21, 2017, were presented to the Quorum Court for review. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Justice Mike Nevens and seconded by Justice Jason Roshto. With there being no further discussion or questions: Vote 9 for 0 against.

The Financial Statement was presented to the Quorum Court. With no opposition to the Financial Statement as presented, a motion to accept was made by Justice Jason Roshto and seconded by Justice Grant Westmoreland. With there being no further discussion or questions: Vote 9 for 0 against.

Judge Randy Pruitt stated that the agenda item listed as, Amend/Repeal: Ordinance Allowing Grant County to become a Vote Center of Grant County, State of Arkansas was removed at this time and will be discussed at a later time when there is more information.

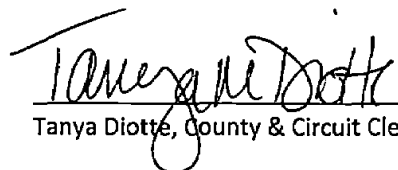
Next on the agenda: Sales Tax were introduced and just reviewed.

Judge Randy Pruitt asked if there has been any response regarding the upcoming elections. No one reported anything negative. Judge Pruitt went on to report, two different times since the first of the year there have been 6 ambulances running at once in Grant County. Early Voting starts on September 28, 2017. The election is on October 10, 2017.

Other Business: Judge Pruitt stated he should receive the final set of drawings for Phase 2 of the Justice Complex any day. A motion allowing Judge Pruitt to accept bids on Phase 2 as soon he receives the final set of drawings was made by Justice Pat O'Bryan and seconded by Justice Mark Allen.
