The Grant County Quorum Court met on Monday, August 17, 2020 in the Grant County Courthouse at 7:00 p.m. with Judge Randy Pruitt presiding. Judge Randy Pruitt called the meeting to order. Members answering roll call were Mark Allen, Danny Bone, Tony Carder, Jim Easley, Mike Nevens, Bobby Pierce, Jason Roshto, and Grant Westmoreland.


The **Minutes** from the Quorum Court Meeting held, **July 20, 2020** were presented to the Quorum Court for review. With no further discussion, a motion to accept was made by Justice Bobby Pierce and seconded by Justice Mike Nevens. Vote 8 for 0 against.

The **Financial Statement** was presented to the Quorum Court. With no further discussion, a motion to accept was made by Justice Grant Westmoreland and seconded by Justice Jason Roshto. Vote 8 for 0 against.


Road Update – Judge Randy Pruitt gave update. Last wooden bridge in Grant County has been replaced by 2 12 x 9 culverts and is now open to traffic. Road Department did a good job in completing in one (1) day. Wing walls still need to be built up to complete. Judge Pruitt reported that the “Chip Seal” should begin mid-September as soon as contractors finish their State Aid work. Preparing for twenty (20) miles of chip seal.

Other Business: Judge Randy Pruitt informed Justices of a planned Phase I opening of the Courthouse front door only beginning September 8, 2020. He explained that we have had Covid 19 cases in the Courthouse and we will do what is necessary to prevent any more cases in the future including Fogging the Courthouse every Friday. He requested from the Quorum Court to hire a Security person under the CARES Act to perform screening, take temperatures, and complete Covid 19 form. This cost is reimburseable to the County under the CARES Act. A motion was made by Justice Mike Nevens and seconded by Justice Bobby Pierce to approve this hiring at a maximum cost of \$18.75 per hour. Vote 8 for 0 against. Treasurer Tim Stuckey reported that the Airport should be breaking ground next week on the Taxi-Way construction.
